1. JDS MACHINERY RALI CEREDIGION - EVENTS & POINTS

The JDS Machinery Rali Ceredigion will be a double header, making up round 5 and round 6 of the championship. Points for round 5 will be calculated from the standings at the end of day 2 (Saturday) / Leg 1. Round 6 will begin at the start of the first-time control on day 3 (Sunday) / Leg 2 and points will be calculated from the itinerary on day 3 / Leg2.

A crew may nominate their joker for either round 5 or round 6 in accordance with BRC Sporting Regulation 5.1.2.

In accordance with the recent Rally Guide 1 issued by the JDS Machinery Ralli Ceredigion, the rally will consist of two permitted events, both completing the same route.

Please see below for a breakdown of BRC classes and the respective event you must enter to be eligible for points. Any crew entering the International Event must hold the appropriate international licence.

2. STARTER POINTS - AMENDMENT TO 5.1.1

Any crew who ~~finishes~~ starts a rally will be awarded 1 point. For clarity, 1 starter point will be awarded to a crew who starts round 5 and 1 starter point will also be awarded to a crew that starts round 6.

3. JOKER POINTS - AMENDMENT TO 5.1.2

Amendment to the above regulation to allow co-drivers to score Joker points.

A Joker can only be played once. In the scenario where a co-driver has been part of a crew that has already played a joker card and competes with a new driver who has yet to play their Joker, the driver may play the Joker, but the co-driver will not be eligible for Joker points.

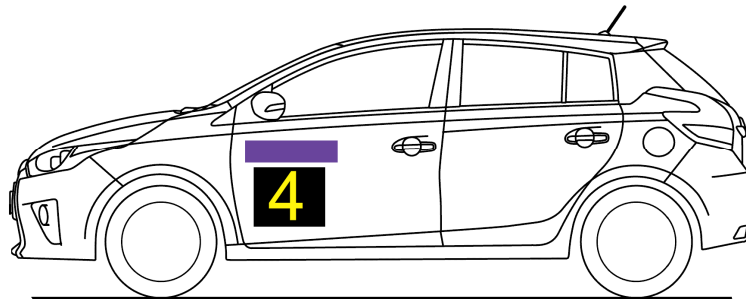
Each driver crew may nominate one round of the championship their 'Joker' event. On their 'Joker' event any additional championship points scored in the top five overall or class positions will be awarded as follows: 1st - 5pts, 2nd - 4pts, 3rd - 3pts, 4th - 2pts, 5th - 1pt. Drivers Crews who nominate their Joker and finish, without using Rally 2, 6th or below in class will be awarded one additional championship point. Notification of a 'Joker' round must be made to the Championship Promoter in writing at least 7 days before the due time of the first car at the first TC of the relevant event.

No Joker points may be claimed if restarting regulations have been used to obtain a finish.

4. DOOR PLATES – AMENDMENT TO 9.2

The drawings in the published version of the BRC regulations remain correct for the JDS Machinery Rali Ceredigion where international style numbering will be present. Expect the event plate to be positioned as per the diagram within the regulations document.

For all other rounds in the championship, the 'Event Plate' listed as 1 in the BRC regulations, will be in accordance with the Motorsport UK Yearbook under Section R, 6.1.3. Please familiarise yourself with these dimensions in the Yearbook and the diagram below to give you a visual aid.



5. POSITIONING OF BRC SUN STRIPS

The BRC sunstrip must be affixed to the top of the windscreen. If other sun strips are fitted to the windscreen, the BRC must be the lowest of any other sun strip – for the avoidance of doubt, please refer to a championship official before fitment.

7. **GLOBECAST & ITV4**

Globecast will be the production team for the BRC highlights show. They will be identifiable on events with both Globecast and ITV4 branding on their apparel. Globecast will also have a compound within the service park. It is expected that all registered crews will work with Globecast to aid in the production of the TV show.

By registering for the BRC you may also be selected for the fitment of an onboard camera which will be installed by the Globecast team.

On round 1 or your first championship event – which ever is earliest – both drivers and co-drivers will be required to attend a media gathering in their race suits where photographs and TV headshots will be taken - **this will be mandatory**. A time and location will be shared in a later communication.
